


BofA Volunteers under the guidance of DCH leaders, Sue Wyndham and Heather Titantich will plant 15 trees on April 19.

# 2023 ANNUAL MEETING

ON APRIL 26, 2023, AT 5:00PM, FHRC WILL HOLD OUR ANNUAL MEETING in the Visitor Center located at 3300 N Market St., Wilmington Delaware, as required by our By-Laws. The purpose of the Annual Meeting is to provide an overview of the organization's plans for future activities, reporting the work and business of directors or officers, and voting and approval of By-Law amendments or any business requiring membership approval.

In the interest of space, we are including only the changes to be made to the By-Laws which were last approved in 2011. Complete by-laws are available to members upon request.

If there are no objections by the voting members present, the following changes will be adopted:

# FRIENDS OF HISTORIC RIVERVIEW CEMETERY, INC. By-Law Changes - 2023

#### ARTICLE I: MISSION

#### **Previous mission statement:**

The mission of FHRC is to support the restoration and preservation of Wilmington's most culturally diverse, non-profit, public cemetery.

#### **Revised mission statement:**

The mission of FHRC is to "operate and maintain Wilmington's most culturally diverse, non-profit, public cemetery, and to support its restoration and preservation."

## • ARTICLE III: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

## **Previous Board of Directors term of office:**

The term of office for each member of the Board of Directors is indefinite.

## Revised Board of Directors term of office:

The term of office for each member of the Board of Directors is three years.

#### • ARTICLE X: AMENDMENTS

#### **Previous Amendments:**

These By-laws may be amended or otherwise changed by a two-thirds vote of the members of FHRC present at the annual meeting, provided that all of the paid members have been notified of the proposed By-law change, by mail or email at least thirty days in advance of the scheduled meeting at which the vote is to be taken.

Members shall be notified of all changes to the By-Laws.

#### **Revised Amendment:**

These By-laws may be amended or otherwise changed by a two-thirds vote of the members of FHRC present at the annual member meeting, provided that all of the paid members have been notified of the proposed By-law change, by mail or email at least thirty days in advance of the scheduled meeting at which the vote is to be taken. Members shall be notified of all changes to the By-Laws.


**BURIALS:** The Board of Directors assisted with 5 burials.
